How EPC cares for the Carers

EPC cares for those who have been diagnosed with a terminal condition, with little or no prospect of cure, and for whom the primary treatment goal is quality of life.

Our services are delivered in the client's home and are free-of-charge. EPC also provides essential services for those caring for their loved ones at home.

Living with and caring for someone with a terminal diagnosis can be tiring and challenging. Maintaining the carer's health and wellbeing is important. We support carers in many ways including;

- The provision of a dedicated Palliative Support Clinician to assist families understand and manage their situation.
- Occupational Therapists to make the home safer, sourcing medical equipment for their home.
- An Overnight Respite Nurse program and nurse on call services to assist clients and carers when needed.
- Our extensive volunteer program also assists carers in many ways, as well as our all ages bereavement support.



We recognise the essential role that carers play in supporting clients at home. This year, we have been raising funds for our Care for the Carers Appeal which will go to EPC programs and services that assist carers. At EPC, our quality of care is focused on both the carer and the clients living well every day. Around the world Tuesday 3 December is known as Giving Tuesday. It's a day of generosity and support for organisations that are making a difference in the community. This year, EPC is aiming to raise \$15K on Giving Tuesday to purchase five much needed Syringe Drivers.

A Syringe Driver is a small portable battery-operated pump that administers medicines into the skin continuously. It helps manage symptoms when oral medications or frequent injections are not effective or difficult. They can be carried in a bag over the shoulder to allow mobility and are easily detached for bathing.

This equipment is vital for palliative care and can be the difference between someone going into hospital or being able to remain at home. We urgently need five more syringe drivers.
